# FIRST INTERIM REPORT PRODUCED

MMSD's first Interim Report *Planning for Outcomes: A Framework for the Consideration of Options* has now been produced in draft, prepared by George Green, François Bregha, Stephanie Meyer and John Moffet of Stratos Inc., Ottawa, Canada. The report examines the range of possible outcomes of MMSD and analyses and evaluates specific mechanisms and approaches that might be applied in implementing the findings and results of all the Project's activities.

As is the case with all of MMSD's Interim Reports, *Planning for Outcomes* is first released as a provisional draft, pending a review by the Project Assurance Group which is expected to occur when the Group meets in January. However, the review process is by no means limited to the members of the Assurance Group and we welcome your comments and suggestions. The document will shortly be available on our website and we invite you to address all correspondence to *Elisabeth.Wood@iied.org*.

We will continue to seek comment and focus for this outline through our website and a variety of broader consultation processes. It is important to bear in mind that the depth of analysis on all

of these topics will vary depending on the existing knowledge base, gaps identified, other initiatives underway and regional priorities.

# NORTH AMERICAN SCOPING MEETINGS

The MMSD North American process is moving into implementation phase with two "subgroup" meetings, one for Canada and one for the USA. The Canadian subgroup will meet in Winnipeg on 18/19 December at the offices of the International Institute for Sustainable Development and the USA subgroup will gather at the Colorado School of Mines on 9/10 January. The purpose of the meetings is to give the participants an overview of MMSD and its activities, to review and amend the proposed 12-month North American action plan, to identify a small set of focus areas for detailed review, and instigate the process of expanding contact with key communities of interest.

Notes from the meetings will be available on the MMSD website early in the new year.

# SCOPING MEETINGS SET FOR GLOBAL DIALOGUE ON FINANCE AND THE MINING AND MINERALS SECTOR

The MMSD project, the World Bank and the United Nations Environment Program are jointly proposing to sponsor a global dialogue on the role of the financial sector in the transition to sustainable development in the minerals sector.

Those who invest in minerals exploration, mining or other minerals companies, or lend money to them, have a clear interest in how that transition will affect companies involved in all aspects of the minerals cycle. This subject is also of clear interest to mining and minerals companies themselves as well as to a variety of other actors.

The purpose of this dialogue would be to identify and examine, from those multiple perspectives, a number of key current issues relating to the sector.

The first step in this process will be two scoping meetings, convened at the World Bank on 10 and 12 January 2001, to which a variety of individuals with diverse interests have been invited to discuss this concept, help identify issues, identify people or organisations who should be involved in this dialogue and discuss what future steps would be appropriate. One of those steps could be a broader meeting in early April.
